Admissions: What You Need to Know

Types of Admission



Applicants in their final year of secondary school are encouraged to apply for early admission by submitting official grade reports from their last two years of study (Grades 10 and 11).

Early applicants must complete the online application and provide:

- official grades from at least two previous years of secondary school study
- SAT or ACT mathematics (as applicable)
- your score from TOEFL or IELTS Academic (if available at the time of applying)

Important:

- Admission to CAAD and CEN is highly competitive. Applicants applying to programs offered by these colleges must apply early to
- Applicants with the highest grades who have the required English proficiency testing scores (and SAT Mathematics or ACT score as applicable) will be given priority consideration.
- Early admission is only offered to highly qualified applicants and not considered final until applicants submit the following documents before they may register may register for

Early applications for Fall Semester 2025 open October 7, 2024 and close on June 12, 2025.

- your score from TOEFL or IELTS Academic (if available at the time of applying)

Transfer

Applicants applying after being enrolled in another university.

Transfer applicants are required to submit the collowing documents:

Transfer applications for Fall Semester 2025 open October 7, 2024, and close on June 19, 2025.

Your admission to AUS will be on a competitive basis, depending on a variety of factors, including:

- your secondary education certificate or school average
- SAT or ACT Math (as applicable and required for all American curriculum students)
- the number of qualified applicants
- · the number of available seats
- your Internet-Based TOEFL (iBT) or AUS Institutional Paper-based TOEFL (ITP) or IELTS (Academic

Application Type



If you are applying to AUS as a fresh high school graduate, you must:

· meet the minimum admission requirements depending on the applicant's type of secondary education program and certificate.

If you are applying to transfer from another university to AUS, you must:

- be in good academic standing (i.e., not dismissed or on probation from the institution from which you are transferring).
- be transferring from a recognized and accredited institution of higher learning offering learning experiences equivalent to those offered at AUS, and have successfully completed one or more semesters at that institution.

Note: The College of Engineering will only accept transfer credit for programs recognized by ABET (www.abet.org). The School of Business Administration will only accept transfer credit for programs recognized by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) (www.aacsb.edu).

- · have met the minimum requirements for admission to AUS prior to your admission to the institution from which you are transferring.
- · submit official transcripts of high school and university/college records along with the syllabi and descriptions of the courses you wish to transfer.
- · have achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average (CGPA) as required by AUS for that type of
- · meet the English language proficiency requirements of AUS.
- CAAD Applicants: Transfer applicants applying to the College of Architecture, Art and Design (CAAD) are requested to submit work samples (portfolio or CD), and those who seek transfer of credit hours for studio courses are advised to provide a portfolio of completed course work in photographic, digital or original format to the Office of Enrollment Management/Undergraduate Admissions.

Important:

- · Courses completed more than five years prior to matriculation as an AUS student are not eligible for
- A maximum of 50 percent of credits completed at another institution may be considered for transfer.
- · Decisions regarding transfer credit eligibility are made solely by the relevant AUS dean or department



Students who leave AUS for two or more consecutive semesters, inclusive of a semester of complete course withdrawal, and wish to resume studies must complete the online Returning Applicant application. Readmission of returning students is subject to AUS academic rules and regulations on readmitting students. All admission requirements in place at the time of applying for readmission must be met.

Application New Transfer Returning

Admission Requirements

As a university with one of the world's most international student communities (*Times Higher Education*), we understand that every applicant is different.

Depending on where you completed your secondary school studies, you'll need to meet specific admission requirements.

The minimum required average to apply for admission consideration is the equivalent of 85 percent or above in the final year of secondary school (depending on the education system), or 85 percent or more in the best two out of the last three years. This average is used as a guideline. However, admission to AUS is competitive, and the minimum average required can vary based on several factors. These include your secondary education scores; the college/major of interest; SAT (if applicable), ACT or EmSAT results; the number of qualified applicants; the availability of seats; and your English proficiency test scores. Additionally, due to the high volume of applicants AUS receives, candidates are encouraged to apply early, and before the published deadlines, to ensure they are considered for admission and/or to their preferred college or major.

Sample Secondary Certificates	Minimum Requirements*
General Secondary School Certificate (Thanawiyah Ammah)	Minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) equivalent to 85% (90% for General Track applicants from UAE schools). Completion of mathematics and physics subjects is also required for engineering and science majors.
American-Style High School Diploma	Minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) equivalent to 85% (90% for General Track applicants from UAE schools). Completion of mathematics and physics subjects is also required for engineering and science majors.
International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma	Attain the full IB diploma with six subjects (excluding Islamic Education) with at least three at the higher level. Applicants with only the IB certificate can apply and will be assessed based on their credentials.

Note: Students who graduated from school and joined the workforce or took a minimum of a one-year gap should submit a Post High School Declaration Form.

All admitted applicants are required to sit for the AUS Admission/Placement tests in English, mathematics and physics as required by their intended major.

Applicants who have completed A-level, AP, IB-higher level, French Baccalaureate or equivalents and achieved minimum listed grades will be considered for exemption from the relevant AUS Admission/Placement test(s).



Preparing Your Documents

To complete your application for admission, you will need to provide specific documents. Use the checklist below to make sure you provide us with everything we need to process your application.

High School Equivalency certificate as required by the UAE Ministry of Education
Official grade reports of the last three secondary school classes certified by the appropriate authorities*
SAT or ACT Math (as applicable and required for all American curriculum students)
A colored scan of your passport
A colored scan of your UAE National ID (for UAE citizens and residents)
The required Internet-Based TOEFL (iBT) or AUS Institutional Paper-based TOEFL (ITP) or IELTS (Academic Version) (if available at the time of applying)
A non-refundable application fee of 420 UAE Dirhams
Submit an official letter confirming completion or exemption of the National Service (for male UAE nationals)
A non-refundable transcript evaluation fee of 400 AED for transfer applicants (deductible from tuition upon joining AUS)

Admission to AUS: The Next Steps

- Confirm your admission: You can check the status of your application by logging in to apply.aus.edu. Admission Letters are sent by email as well.
- 2. Pay your deposit to secure your place: To guarantee a seat reservation, you will be required to pay a 5,000 UAE Dirhams deposit, along with a 500 UAE Dirhams residential hall room deposit if you choose to live on campus. Both deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable under any circumstances and must be paid before the deadline indicated in your Admission Letter.
- **3. Take the first-year placement tests:** All first-year students are required to take placement tests, based on their selected major as shown below:

Financial Grants and Scholarships

Each year, approximately two-thirds of all enrolled AUS students benefit from merit scholarships and/or need-based financial grants.

These designated funds are available for highly qualified undergraduate students with limited financial resources. Once you have received your official Admission Letter, you may apply online for a grant or scholarship. Admitted students may apply for a financial grant, regardless of their race, color, gender, disabilities, religion or national origin.

Scholarships for New Students

■ President's Scholarship

100% of tuition and lab fees, application fee waiver, monthly stipend, on-campus housing, round-trip tickets, student medical insurance

Open to applicants who have completed their secondary education outside the UAE who are first-time, first-year students starting in the fall semester. Renewable based on maintaining the scholarship's requirements.

Application Deadline: Second Thursday of March of each year

■ Chancellor's Scholarship

100% of tuition and lab fees, application fee waiver, on-campus housing, student medical insurance

Open to applicants who have completed their secondary education in the UAE who are first-time, first-year students starting in the fall semester. Renewable based on maintaining the scholarship's requirements.

Application Deadline: Second Thursday of March of each year

■ Merit Scholarships (subject to available budget)

10 to 30% of tuition and lab/technology fees

AUS offers a range of Merit Scholarships to academically qualified applicants with a high school average equivalent to 90 percent or above. Merit Scholarships are automatically offered at the time of processing the admission application. A separate application is not required.

■ Sharakah School Scholarship

45% of tuition, lab/technology fees and oncampus housing fees

Partner Sharakah Program Schools can select/nominate one exceptional student (an AUS applicant) from their school for the Sharakah School Scholarship. Applicants must be evaluated by an established school committee. Offered in fall semesters only.

Grants

■ Financial Grant

5 to 50% of tuition and housing fees

For first-time, transfer and returning full-time undergraduate students with demonstrated limited financial resources. Amount awarded depends on personal financial needs and academic qualifications.

■ Family Tuition Grant

25% of tuition and lab/technology fees

For families with more than one son/ daughter enrolled as full-time students at AUS at the same time. Awarded to each sibling after the first.




